



Bali Democracy Students Conference (BDSC)

"FROM CAMPUS FOR DEMOCRACY"

Nusa Dua, Bali, 7 - 8 December 2017

What is BDSC?

BDSC is a conference among students on the issues of democracy, as part of the 10th Bali Democracy Forum (BDF). The conference is to be held in Nusa Dua, Bali, Indonesia, on 7-8 December 2017, parallel with the 10th BDF.

It is organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia to mark the 10th of the BDF.

What is the Main Objective of BDSC?

- To transfer and share knowledge about the discourse on democracy at the BDF to young generation
- To get inputs, new ideas, and absorb aspiration and perspectives of the students concerning democracy

Who can participate?

Participants of BDSC are 100 students, consists of:

- Indonesian students from various universities in Indonesia
- International students currently study in Indonesia
- Indonesian students diaspora abroad

How to participate?

For International students, prepare the following documents:

- Filled-in registration form
- Curriculum Vitae
- Recommendation Letter from the University
- Copy of passport
- Photo (4X6 cm, colour)
- Statement Letter stating willingness to participate in the whole program of BDSC in Bali from 6 to 9 December 2017

.....and send them to BDSC Committee at bdsc.committee@kemlu.go.id before **9th October 2017**. The committee will conduct selection process to all applicants.

For selected candidates, the Committee will bear the cost associated with participation in the conference, i.e:

- Hotel accommodation from 6 to 9 December 2017 (3 nights)
- Local transport (airport-hotel-venue) from 6 to 9 December 2017
- Meals from 6 to 9 December 2017

Outline of the Conference

The conference, themed "From Campus for Democracy", will conduct deliberation on issues related to democracy from students' perspectives. Participants will be divided into two groups for parallel Panel Discussions. One chairperson and three speakers for each Panel should be selected among the participants, to facilitate the discussions.

Conference will start with a joint session with BDF for Opening Session. After coffee break, each Panel Discussion begin with presentations from 3 speakers, followed by discussions with all participants. BDSC will rejoin BDF at the Closing Session, and a representative of BDSC will be requested to present a report as an outcome of the conference called "Voice of the Youth".
